Powerful Tools for Caregivers

Genuine self-care is crucial for family caregivers caring for loved ones. In this **six-week virtual class** for unpaid family caregivers, participants will learn how to reduce personal stress, communicate their needs effectively in challenging situations, deal with difficult emotions and make tough care-giving decisions.
